However, improper cable tray design or installation may lead to electrical faults: Overcrowding of Cables: Excess cables in a tray cause heat buildup, increasing fire risk and reducing cable life. Many beginners assume that a 100mm x 50mm tray has an area of 5000mm², so they can fit 5000mm² of cable into it. The insulation, when completely installed, without damage either to conductors or structural system use maintain spacing or to keep cables in place when the tray is erect the minimum bend radius for cables as they exit the bottom of the cable tray. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when.
