Step 4: Install the Transceiver Carefully insert the transceiver into the switch port until it clicks securely. Verify that it is compatible with the switch and the fiber cable type.

Step 5: Connect the Fiber Cable Attach the fiber cable to the transceiver, ensuring send and receive strands are correctly aligned (A to B, B to A). Connect the other end to the corresponding device, such as another switch, router, or media converter.

Step 6: Verify the Connection Power on the switch and check the link/activity LEDs on the transceiver. A stable light indicates a successful connection. If using multiple switches, consider a star or daisy chain topology to optimize performance.

Optional: Use Patch Panels or Media Converters For larger networks, fiber patch panels help organize cables, and media converters allow connections to switches without SFP ports. By following these steps, you can establish a high-speed, reliable fiber optic...
