- Outer housing:** Made from durable, impact-resistant materials such as ABS+PC plastic, often rated IP55 or IP65 for waterproof and dustproof protection.
- Adapter tray:** Protects fiber connector points and supports various connector types (FC, SC, LC).
- Splice trays and cable organizers:** Maintain proper bending radius (usually $\geq 30\text{mm}$) and secure fiber splices and pigtails.
- Splitter compatibility:** Some FTBs support PLC splitters (1:4, 1:8) for optical distribution in FTTx networks.

Types and Installation FTBs are available in wall-mounted, rack-mounted, and pole-mounted configurations to suit different deployment scenarios:

- Wall-mounted FTBs:** Compact, ideal for indoor environments like offices, homes, or small data closets.
- Rack-mounted FTBs:** Designed for telecom rooms or data centers, supporting higher fiber counts and front-access panels for easier maintenance.
- Pole-mounted or outdoor FTBs:** Weatherproof enclosures suitable for outdoor installations on utility poles or near communication towers.
