Mismatched speed, duplex, or negotiation settings can prevent the port from recognizing the module. Test and Replace Components. If the module still cannot be inserted or recognized: Try a different compatible SFP/SFP+ module in the same port. Test the module in another port to rule out a faulty slot. Perform a self-loop test to verify the port functionality. Replace the fiber cable if it is bent, damaged, or incompatible. B...
