

Fiber optic router patch cord

- Connect the ONT to the Router:** Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port. If your router has a fiber SFP port, you can insert the patch cord directly into the router instead of using an ONT.
- Power On the Router:** Turn on the router and wait for it to establish a connection with the ONT. Configure the router with ISP credentials if required.

Important Considerations

- Connector Compatibility:** Always match the patch cord connector type to the device port to avoid signal loss or damage.
- Fiber Type:** Single-mode fiber is typically used for long distances, while multimode fiber is suitable for shorter distances and high-speed LANs.
- Signal Conversion:** Standard routers cannot interpret optical signals directly unless they have a fiber port; the ONT is essential for converting light signals to electrical signals.
- Cable Handling:** Avoid bending the fiber beyond its minimum bend radius and keep...
