

Horizontal cable tray support spacing 2 meters



Overview

Automatic support spacing recommendations per BS EN 61537: 3m for ladder tray, 1.2m for trunking (horizontal and vertical). Although BS 7671 touches on the subject of cable supports, it does not detail specifically what these support distances should be. 8 (Other Mechanical Stresses (A)) in that document provides requirements for cable support. Cable ladder systems and cable tray systems shall be manufactured in accordance with BS EN 61537, channel support. The spacing between trays, whether horizontal or vertical, depends on various factors like cable type, environment, and tray material. Proper installation can significantly reduce electromagnetic interference, prevent fire hazards, and improve overall efficiency.

Place horizontal wye supports within 600 mm (2 ft) of each of the three openings connected to other cable tray items, and at 22-1/2° point of the arc adjacent to the side branch.

Place horizontal wye supports within 600 mm (2 ft.) of each of the three openings connected to other cable tray items, and at the 22-1/2° point of the arc adjacent to the side branch.
