

How to check the port of the connected switch

To check a switch port connection, verify physical link status, run CLI commands to inspect port activity, and use monitoring or testing tools to detect errors or faults.

Physical Inspection Start by examining the LED indicators on the switch port. A green light typically indicates a good link, while amber or red may signal errors or a down link. CLI Commands Use the switch command-line interface to check port status and connectivity:

- `show interface status` - displays whether the port is up or down and its speed/duplex settings.
- `show mac address-table interface` - verifies if the switch is learning MAC addresses on that port.
- `show run interface` - checks the configuration of the port.
- `show module` - provides module and port information.
- `test cable-diagnostics tdr interface` - runs a Time Domain Reflectometer (TDR) test to detect open or shorted copper cables and approximate fault location.

Cable and Connectivity Testing For copper cables, TDR tests can identify open, short, or broken pairs. For fiber, ensure proper termination and correct cable type. Tools like LinkSprinter or LinkRunner can test port connectivity, VLAN configuration, and end-to-end path performance. Periodic soak tests can reveal intermittent issues.

Monitoring and Verification Switch port monitoring helps detect errors, congestion, or unauthorized access. Track metrics such as port utilization, error rates, traffic flow, and link status. Use monitoring tools or built-in switch features like NetFlow or port mirroring to capture traffic for analysis. Alerts can be configured for unusual activity to proactively troubleshoot issues.
