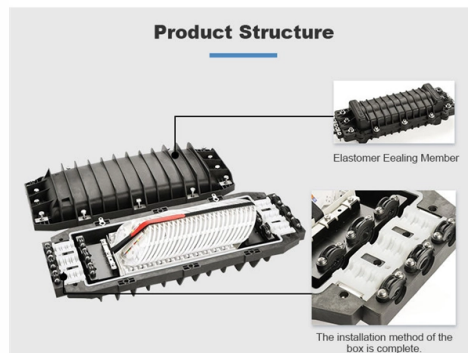


How to connect the wires in the lighting distribution box

Wiring a lighting distribution box involves connecting the main supply to the isolator, then distributing power through RCCBs and MCBs to individual lighting circuits, with proper neutral and earth connections. Components of a Distribution Box

A typical lighting distribution box includes:

- Main isolator:** Acts as the main switch to open or close the power supply.
- RCCB (Residual Current Circuit Breaker):** Protects against current leakage and electric shock.
- MCBs (Miniature Circuit Breakers):** Protect individual lighting circuits from overload or short circuits.
- Neutral and Earth bars:** Distribute neutral and earth connections to subcircuits.
- Incoming feeder cable:** Connects the utility supply to the distribution box.

Step-by-Step Wiring Procedure

- Turn off the main power before starting any work to ensure safety.
- Connect the incoming phase and neutral wires from the energy meter to the main isolator. The isolator allows manual disconnection of the entire system.
- From the isolator, connect phase and neutral lines to the RCCB. The RCCB protects against leakage currents and electric shocks.
- Connect the neutral wire from the RCCB to the neutral bar and the phase wire in parallel to the MCBs. Each MCB will control a separate lighting subcircuit.
- Wire the MCBs to the lighting circuits. Each MCB should be rated according to the load of the connected lights. For example, a 10A MCB can handle multiple light points in a typical residential circuit.
- Connect the earth wire from the earth bar to the earth pit using an earth rod. Proper earthing is essential for safety and to prevent electric shocks.
- Label each MCB to indicate which lighting circuit it controls. This helps in maintenance and troubleshooting.
- Check all connections for tightness and correct polarity. Ensure no bare wires are exposed and that cable clamps secure the wires inside the box.
