

How to open the fiber optic port on a switch

- Configure the port:** Assign the port to the correct VLAN, set speed and duplex if required, and enable the interface using commands like interface followed by no shutdown.
- Verify operation:** Use show interface and show interface transceiver to check link status, speed, and any errors.

- Avoid direct eye contact with fiber optic lasers; they can cause eye damage.
- Ensure transceivers on both ends support the same speed and type.
- Clean connectors before insertion to prevent signal degradation.
- Use multimode fiber for short runs and singlemode for longer distances to optimize cost and performance.
