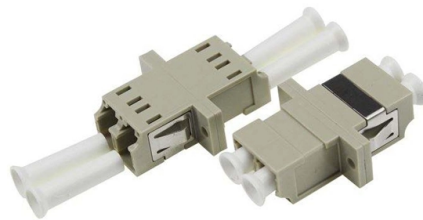


How to remove the fiber optic pigtail

6. Inspect the Fiber Check the stripped fiber under magnification for scratches or nicks. Any damage can compromise the splice and lead to signal loss.
7. Ready for Splicing Once stripped and cleaned, the fiber pigtail is ready to be fused to the main fiber using a fusion splicer or mechanical splice.

Best Practices Always use sharp, well-maintained stripping tools to avoid jagged cuts. Strip each layer progressively; never attempt to remove multiple layers at once. Handle the glass fiber carefully; it is fragile and can break easily. Use pre-tested, high-quality pigtails to reduce installation errors.
