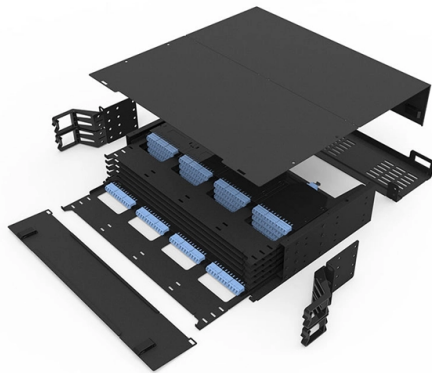

Cable Entry Preparation: Feed cables through the designated entry ports. Use breakout plates to secure the cable sheath, Kevlar, and central strength members before stripping the outer jacket ().

- Splice Trays:** Place fibers into splice trays to protect fusion splices and maintain proper bend radius. Use pigtailed for connecting incoming fibers to the patch panel adapters ().
- Routing:** Use horizontal and vertical cable guides, rings, or holders to prevent fiber stress. Maintain minimum bend radius to avoid signal loss ().
- Microducts:** For micro cables, use additional vertical racks or holders near the ODF for proper routing ().

Termination and Patch Panel Connections

- Connectorization:** Insert fiber connectors into the patch panel adapters. Ensure each fiber is labeled clearly for identification and future troubleshooting ().
- Cross-Connects:** Organize fibers to allow easy interco...
