Transformer boxes may also have cooling systems (oil or air) that, if damaged, could leak or overheat.

Environmental Considerations Electrical rooms can generate noise and heat, and the confined space may not meet standard living conditions. Continuous exposure to these factors can affect comfort and well-being. Additionally, substations and distribution boxes are typically restricted areas for safety and legal reasons, making long-term habitation impractical and potentially illegal.

Recommendations Avoid living inside or immediately adjacent to electrical distribution rooms whenever possible. If proximity is unavoidable, measure EMF levels using a Gauss meter and ensure they are within recommended safety limits. Maintain safe distances from high-voltage equipment and follow all posted safety guidelines....
