Sub-panels typically do not have a main breaker; instead, they rely on the main panel's breaker for overall power control. They are ideal for larger buildings, workshops, or outbuildings, providing flexibility and safety by isolating circuits.

How They Work Together

Power Flow: Electricity enters the main distribution box from the utility. The main breaker protects the entire system.

Branching: Selected circuits are fed from the main panel to the auxiliary distribution box.

Localized Control: The auxiliary box distributes power to its designated circuits, allowing independent management and protection.

Safety: Both panels include protective devices to prevent overloads, short circuits, and electrical hazards.
