Cable Management Accessories: Includes cable guides, wraps, and routing channels to maintain proper bend radius and prevent signal loss. Functions ODFs perform several critical functions in fiber networks: Termination: Connecting incoming fibers to connectors (e.g., LC, SC, ST) within the ODF. Splicing: Joining fiber ends using fusion or mechanical splicing, with protection in trays. Patching: Using patch cords to cross-connect fibers for flexible routing. Distribution: Directing fibers to their final destinations, such as from a central office to residential or enterprise endpoints. Applications ODFs are widely used in: Telecom central offices (COs) for managing large volumes of fiber connections. Data centers to organize high-density fiber networks. Fiber-to-the-home...
