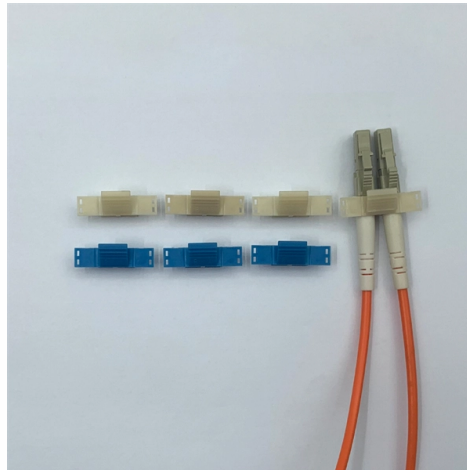


Package loss when pinging the core switch from the terminal
