Openings around the tray should be sealed with fire-resistant materials such as fire-rated boards, firestop packs, firestop mastic, or mineral wool . For large openings, a fire-resistant backing plate can be installed before sealing. Gaps between the firestop material and cables should be minimal, ideally not exceeding 1 cm², and packing thickness should be at least 24 cm . Cover plates should be square, evenly painted, and securely mounted to close the opening. Retrofit Solutions For existing installations where firestopping or wall reinforcement is insufficient, retrofit devices like the EZ Path® Cable Tray Retrofit Device can be used. This two-part system installs around non-compliant cable tray penetrations, restoring fire resistance and smoke containment without disrupting active cables .
