

## Spacing of cable tray fixing brackets 6



### AI Overview

Cable tray fixing brackets should generally be spaced 3–5 meters for horizontal runs and less than 2 meters for vertical runs, with additional support at turns and ends.

**Horizontal Runs** For straight horizontal sections of cable trays, brackets or supports should be installed at the start, end, and at every 3 to 5 meters along the tray. Additional supports are required at bends, tees, or changes in direction to prevent sagging and maintain structural integrity. **Vertical Runs** For vertical cable tray runs, supports should be fixed to the building structure with a spacing preferably less than 2 meters, with cables secured at the top and every 1.5 meters. This prevents cables from shifting, maintains order, and ensures stability for vertical runs.

**Cable Binding** When binding cables within trays, the distance between ties should not exceed 1.5 meters, ensuring even tension and preventing cable damage. For troughs or wireways, binding may not always be necessary, but proper securing is recommended for safety and organization.

**Additional Considerations**

- Material and fire resistance:** All supports should be made of fire-resistant materials to prevent premature failure in case of fire.
- Height and clearance:** Cable trays should ideally be installed at least 2.2 meters above the ground, with a minimum 0.3 meters clearance from ceilings or obstructions.
- Fill rate:** The tray should not exceed 50% of its cross-sectional fill to allow proper airflow and prevent overheating.
- Compliance:** Installation should follow BS EN 61537 standards for cable trays and associated supports, ensuring mechanical stability and safety.

By following these spacing guidelines, cable trays will maintain structural integrity, reduce mechanical stress on cables, and comply with safety standards.
