

Specifications of grounding flat steel inside cable tray



Overview

The core requirements for Cable Tray grounding, as per GB 50303-2015, GB 51348-2019, and CECS 31-2023, can be summarized as "metals must be grounded, connections must ensure conductivity, and multiple points must ensure reliability". Cable tray may be used as the Equipment Grounding Conductor (EGC) in any installation where qualified persons will service the installed cable tray system. The specific provisions and implementation points are as follows:

- Grounding and bonding are mandatory for metallic trays. Tray fill limits must be calculated properly. Firestop systems are required at penetrations. Understanding NEC Article 392: Cable. It is essential that the grounding of cable tray systems, including the cables in the tray systems, is inspected for compliance with the grounding requirements in the National Electrical Code (NEC) BEFORE the cabling in the tray is energized and BEFORE cable is installed.
