Cable Management and Securing Cables should be tied to the tray rungs using high-quality cable ties or clamps to prevent slippage. In vertical installations, it is critical to prevent free-fall hazards; consider using secondary steel wires or fail-safe mechanisms to catch cables in case of tie failure. Avoid simply turning a horizontal tray on its side, as this relies solely on ties and increases the risk of cables sliding and piling up.

Spacing and Heat Dissipation Maintain adequate spacing between cables to allow airflow and prevent overheating. Ladder trays without covers are ideal for vertical shafts because they maximize ventilation and minimize dust accumulation. Wider trays may require stronger rungs to safely support the load.

Installation Sequence It is generally easier to pull cables upward rather than downward, but pushing with synchronized cable pushers can be used if pulling is not feasible. Ensure proper snaking of cables to avoid tension points and prevent conductor elongation or insulation cracking.

Maintenance and Safety Vertical trays reduce long-term maintenance risks by keeping cables at consistent heights and minimizing dust and water accumulation. Plan for safe access during installation and future maintenance, and ensure compliance with relevant standards such as BS EN 61537 for cable tray systems.

CABLE TRAY

Cables may be fastened to the cable tray by means of cable clamps or cable ties (See Figures 5.7 and 5.8). Generally, cables are fastened every 450 mm (18 in.) on vertical runs.

Typical Design Philosophy of Cable Trays for Power Plant

Vertically running cable trays in cable riser/shaft shall be supported at an interval of 1000 mm. In case cables are to be laid over the top of switchgear panels, a clearance of 300 mm shall be maintained.
