

What are the different power distribution levels in a distribution box

- Function:** supplies power to power equipment such as motors or machinery
- Voltage:** three-phase 0.4 kV, suitable for industrial or commercial loads
- Design:** often includes inner and outer doors, powder-coated exteriors, and rainproof tops for outdoor use

Tertiary Distribution Box The tertiary distribution box is the final distribution point, delivering electricity directly to end-use devices or households . Key points include:

- Equipment:** single-phase circuit breakers and leakage protection devices
- Function:** provides mains electricity (typically 220V single-phase) to individual appliances or units
- Design:** can be fixed or portable, ensuring individual circuit protection
- Safety:** follows the principle of "one machine, one switch, one leakage, one box," preventing multiple devices from being controlled by a single sw...
